Civil War Trivia

In Vietnam, 1 in 400 of the wounded died of their injuries. In the Korean War, 1 in 50 wounded American soldiers died. In the Civil War, 1 in 7 wounded Federals died and 1 in 5 wounded Confederates died—sometimes within minutes, sometimes after months of suffering.

Volunteers Sought for Park Day

On April 2 Park Day will celebrate its twentieth year of bringing history buffs, preservationists and volunteers of all ages together to serve their communities at historic sites nationwide. These volunteers team up with the Civil War Trust to answer the call to service at 125 sites in 29 states across the country.

In Lone Jack, the Lone Jack Historical Society will host a Park Day event at the Civil War Battlefield Museum and Cemetery. Raking leaves and flower beds, clearing limbs and brush outside

to sweeping and dusting inside the museum and Cave Hotel are needed to launch the spring tourist season.

In 1862 Union soldiers and Confederate recruits battled one another in the center of town. Many were laid to rest in Lone Jack's hallowed battlefield ground. On April 2 as volunteers honor these brave men by defeating winter's onslaught to clean and restore the battlefield and cemetery, museum and Cave Hotel, they honor all American veterans who came before and after them by sprucing up this veterans' memorial.

The Lone Jack Historic Society manages the maintenance and upkeep for the park's museum and cemetery. It is a rewarding, but time-consuming job. Volunteers are needed outdoors to clear limbs and brush and rake the cemetery and flowerbeds. Inside needs include dusting displays, mopping floors and washing windows among other jobs at the museum and Cave Hotel.

Registration begins at 8:30 a.m. on Saturday, April 2, at the Lone Jack Civil War Battlefield Museum, ½ mile south of Hwy. 50. Clean up begins at 9:00 a.m. Volunteers receive a t-shirt. Lunch will be provided to those who sign up in advance. Clean up should be finished by around 2:00 p.m.

Wilson's Creek National Battlefield will be presenting “Threads through the Past”, a Women's History Month Textile Exhibit. The exhibit will be open on March 4th-6th; 11th-13th; and 18-20th, 2016. Come and celebrate the anniversary of Your National Park Service.

Wilson's Creek NB has scheduled this event during the year-long celebration of the Centennial of your National Park Service. According to Supt Hillmer, “This exhibit, and others, will be planned and scheduled to provide an opportunity to visit your National Park Service. Come and enjoy your favorite battlefield.”

The historic quilts will be on display in the Multi-Purpose Room of the park's Visitor Center and will be open on the above dates from 9:00 a.m. to noon and 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. The exhibit will feature quilts from the park's museum collection as well as quilts on loan to the park from private individuals. Park staff and volunteers will be available to answer questions and handle the quilts.

Wilson's Creek National Battlefield preserves and commemorates the first major battle of the Civil War in the West. Administered by the National Park Service, the battlefield is located 10 miles
